














PLAY BALL!

"Centering Prayer is a receptive method of silent prayer in which we experience God's presence within us and is both a relationship with God and a discipline to foster that relationship" (Fr. Thomas Keating, OCSO, a founding member and spiritual guide of Contemplative Outreach). The Centering Prayer Introductory Workshop familiarizes participants with the method of Centering Prayer and its conceptual background and offers two opportunities to experience the prayer.

Following the Introductory Workshop, four different locations in the DC metro area will offer four Continuing Sessions to provide support, and the time needed to establish a personal Centering Prayer practice. Sessions include videos and discussion.
