DIACONATE TEAM BEGINS CONVERSATIONS ABOUT FBC'S PRACTICE OF INCLUSION

For decades, the FBCDC congregation has included active members -- including many people serving in leadership roles -- who identify as members of the LGBT (Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual and Transgender) communities. However, the church for most of its existence did not have any formal policy about just how fully LGBT people could be involved in the life of the church.

In 2004, in the context of discussions around human sexuality, the church overwhelmingly voted in favor of a membership policy. It explicitly affirmed that all are welcome in Christ's body and that the only criterion for membership at FBCDC is faith in Christ. In the last two years, our congregation has again begun an intentional conversation about further clarifying the role of LGBT people at FBCDC, including celebrating their marriages and families. The Diaconate has appointed an Inclusion Team to more closely study the issue and make recommendations to the congregation.



This team held its first meeting in mid-October. At that meeting, the team agreed to a process that will include:

- Examining Scripture and history and praying together for God's guidance;
- Studying how peer congregations have handled this issue in recent years;
- Holding small discussion and discernment groups with the congregation in the early part of 2017;
- And making a recommendation for an Inclusion Policy for the full congregation to discuss and consider.



PHENOMENAL RESPONSE TO PLEDGE CAMPAIGN

Great news! We not only met, but exceeded our pledge goal. Earlier this

fall, our stewardship team set a "leap of faith" giving goal of \$315,000 for next year (a 12% increase over last year) as well as a pledae aoal of 50 (12 more than last year). During this generosity campaign the FBC family



responded with 55 commitments in

the amount of \$310, 442. Of the 55 pledges received this year, 19 are firsttime commitments. The generosity unfolding around us points to the Spirit at work in our congregation. Thanks be to God!

Advent Begins This Sunday

The Christian year, sometimes called the liturgical year, is a centuries-old way of marking time for Christfollowers in the global church. The beginning of the Christian year is Advent, the four-week season leading up to Christmas Day. "Advent" means "the coming." Advent is about remembering that God came to be with us once, and God is still with us, and God is coming again to set all things right. Advent invites us to resist the fever of a commercialized Christmas by taking hold of the simple joy of opening our lives to Jesus. At First Baptist, we suspend committee meetings and other "business" during Advent, allowing us to focus on worship, acts of compassion, and nurturing relationships with one another and with our neighbors.



Advent Devotional Book

This year's Advent devotional booklet. "From Heaven Above," by Michael Hoy, is based on Martin Luther's hymn of the same name. The author looks at a gift that comes each week of the season: love, hope, peace and life.
