# Summer Guest Preachers



### July 24: Stan Hastey

A native of Oklahoma, Stan grew up in a missionary family in Mexico. After high school graduation from the American School of Torreón, he earned the B.A. from Oklahoma Baptist University, and M.Div. and Ph.D. degrees from the Southern Baptist Theological Seminary.


For 15 years following seminary, Stan worked as a journalist at the Baptist Joint Committee here in Washington where he covered the White House and the Supreme Court for the Baptist Press news service, and was a Supreme Court correspondent for the interfaith Religion News Service. From 1989 to 2009, Stan served the Alliance of Baptists, a nation-wide association of congregations and individual members committed to historic Baptist principles and to ecumenical and interfaith relationships.

Stan and Bettie have called FBCDC their church home since 1983. Stan has served our congregation as a deacon and on several committees. From June 2013 through December 2015 he was the church's interim preaching minister. They have two adult children, Lisa and Steve.



# July 31: Sam Hill

Sam serves as Lead Teacher of our Saturday night contemporary worship service, Mosaic. He's also an attorney for the Department of the Navy where he specializes in civil rights law and conflict resolution. He graduated last year from the University of Missouri School of Law and next year will complete a master of public affairs in nonprofit management, also from the University of Missouri. Sam received a bachelor of arts in religion from William Jewell College (Kansas City, MO). During that time he interned for two summers at FBCDC and studied theology for two terms at the University of Oxford. Sam was licensed into ministry in 2007 and has served as interim pastor in three churches. In his free time, he likes to write, tell stories, and watch the Kansas City Royals.



### August 7: J. Brent Walker

Brent is the Executive Director of the Baptist Joint Committee for Religious Liberty here in Washington, DC. For almost three decades he has dedicated his professional life to upholding the historic Baptist principle of religious liberty, defending the free exercise of religion and protecting against its establishment by government. Both a member of the Supreme Court Bar and an ordained minister, he is a sought-after speaker and national media commentator on church-state issues.

Brent has served the Baptist Joint Committee since 1989, first as associate general counsel and, upon the retirement of executive director (and FBCDC member) James Dunn, Brent was called to be the agency's fifth executive director. He is the longest-serving staff member in the 80-year history of the BJC.

Brent earned B.A. and M.A. degrees from the University of Florida, an M.Div. degree from Southern Seminary, and holds a J.D. degree from Stetson University College of Law. He received an honorary Doctor of Divinity degree from the John Leland Center for Theological Studies in 2013. His wife, Nancy, is pastor for congregational care at Columbia Baptist Church in Falls Church. They have two adult children and two grandchildren.

Pastor Jimmy Diggs will bring greetings in worship this Sunday from Mt. Galilee Baptist Church near Monrovia, Liberia.
